**Sub: Engagement of CMPs against Study leave vacancies – regd.**

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Vide Board's letter No. 2020/E(GR)II/1/1 dated 12.01.2021, it was inter-alia conveyed to All Indian Railway/PUs that it is not feasible to permit engagement of Contract Medical Practitioners (CMPs) against temporary vacancies arising on account of IRHS doctors proceeding on sanctioned Study leave.

2. Recently, requests have been received from some of the Zonal Railways again, seeking permission for engagement of CMPs against Study leave vacancies and also requesting Board's office to revisit the letter dated 12.01.2021, stating that when an officer is on any kind of leave (on leave salary), for more than one year, it is taken as vacancy and therefore filled-up by promotion or by posting some other officer to look after the duties.

3. The issue has been re-examined in Board's office in consultation with Health Dte., and it is reiterated that engagement of CMPs against Study leave vacancies has **not** been found feasible as this amounts to incurring 'double expenditure' for the same post.

4. As regards shortage of doctors on account of ADMOs availing Study leave, attention is drawn to Board's instructions contained in letter No. E(O)III-2016/PL/03 dated 17.10.2006 which prescribe that General Managers, while considering the proposals for grant of study leave, shall satisfy themselves that more than the required number of specialists are not already available and that the work can be managed without substitute during the absence of the officers, who have been granted study leave.

5. This has the concurrence of DG/HR & DG/RHS, Railway Board.

6. South Western Railway's letter No. SWR/HQ/P.108/CMP/2022 dated 08.12.2022 also stands disposed of.

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Please refer to the correspondence resting with Central Railway's letters under reference (i) & (ii) on the subject mentioned above (copies attached for ready reference).

2. Vide letter at ref. (i) above, Central Railway has requested for permitting engagement of Contract Medical Practitioners (CMPs) against temporary vacancies arising on account of Indian Railway Health Service (IRHS) Doctors proceeding on Study Leave.

3. Medical Officers proceeding on sanctioned Study Leave are on Roll Strength and shall draw leave salary in terms of Rule 7 of Appendix V of the Indian Railway Establishment Code Vol, I 1985 Edition (Study Leave Rules), Board's letter No. F(E)III/2(2)/3 dated 11.10.2018 (RBE/156/2018) and E(P&A)II-2017/HRA-4 dated 05.12.2017 (copies enclosed) during the period of study leave. The period spent on study leave shall also be counted for earning both Leave on Average Pay (LAP) and Leave on Half Average Pay (LHAP) in terms of Railway Board's letter No. F(E)III/2009/LE-1/1 dated 04.01.2011 (copy enclosed). Also there being provision of Leave Reserve, engaging CMPs against Study Leave vacancies, therefore, amounts to incurring double or duplicate expenditure for the same post. Besides, as per policy being followed in the nodal Ministry i.e. Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoH&FW) as regards engagement of CMPs on sanction of study leave to regular doctors of Central Health Service (CHS), no contractual appointment in respect of CHS vacancies is made against temporary vacancies.

4. Central Railway vide another proposal under reference (ii) above has also requested for increasing the period of engagement to one year at a time and without specifically mentioning "COVID duty", for CMPs to be engaged to handle COVID pandemic, as CMPs are not turning up for interview in the name of COVID duty and also because of short duration of engagement. In this regard it is stated that directions have already been issued to All Indian Railways to engage CMPs w.e.f. 01.04.2020 to 30.06.2021 or till the pandemic of COVID-19 continues whichever is earlier as per their local requirements in order to handle shortage of doctors during COVID-19 pandemic. These instructions do not state that the Medical Practitioners so engaged would be deployed for COVID duties only. As such, the proposal of Central Railway for allowing engagement of Medical Practitioners for one year exclusively other than COVID purpose is not feasible of acceptance. The special dispensation for engagement of Medical Practitioners is to handle shortage of doctors during COVID pandemic only.

5. The above issues have been examined in consultation with Health Directorate, Associate Finance of this Ministry and MoH&FW and not found feasible of acceptance. Board Member /Finance and CRB & CEO have, therefore, not acceded to the proposals of Central Railway under reference (i) & (ii) above. However, Board's letters under reference (iii) and (iv) above may be referred to for further guidance regarding engagement of CMPs.

6. This issues with the concurrence of Associate Finance, Ministry of Railways.

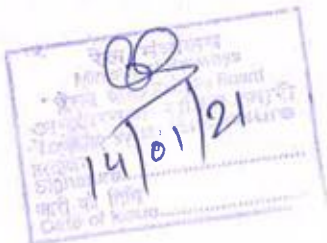

## APPENDIX V (See Rule 556) STUDY LEAVE RULES

**7. Leave salary during study leave.** —(1) "During Study Leave availed outside India a Railway servant shall draw leave salary equal to the pay that the Railway servant shall draw while on duty immediately before proceeding such leave, in on such leave in addition to Dearness Allowance and House Rent allowance as admissible in terms of Board's letter No. E(P&A)II-2002/HRA-2 dated 19.02.2002.' "

(2) (a) During study leaves availed in India, a Railway servant shall draw leave salary equal to the pay that the Railway servant drew while on duty immediately before proceeding on such leave in addition to the Dearness Allowance and House Rent Allowance as admissible in terms of Board's letter No. E(P&A)II-2002/ HRA-2 dated 19.02.2002.

(b) Payment of leave salary at full rate under clause (a) shall be subject to furnishing of a certificate by the Railway servant to the effect that he is not in receipt of any scholarship, stipend or remuneration in respect of any part time employment.

(c) The amount, if any received by a Railway servant during the period of study leave as scholarship or stipend or remuneration in respect of any part time employment shall be adjusted against the leave salary payable under this sub-rule subject to the condition that the leave salary shall not be reduced to an amount less than that payable as leave salary during half pay leave. Rules 8, 9 & 10 shall be omitted.



STUDY LEAVE RULES:

ADVANCE CORRECTION SLIP No.:- 134

1. In sub-rule 5(i) of Rule 1, after the word "Government", following shall be inserted:-  
"(two years in case of Railway Medical Service Officer)"
2. In sub-rule 5(ii) & (iii) of Rule 1, Rule 2(2), Rule 14(1) and each of the Forms namely Form 'A', Form 'B', Form 'C' and Form 'D' appended to study leave Rules contained in Appendix-V, wherever Five occurs, it shall be read as Eight.
3. In sub-rule (3) of Rule 5, the words "and subject to the other conditions laid down in rule (8) being satisfied, draw study allowance in respect thereof" shall be omitted.
4. Sub-rule (1) of Rule 7 shall be substituted with the following:-  
"During study leave availed outside India, a Railway servant shall draw leave salary equal to the pay that the Railway servant shall draw while on duty immediately before proceeding on such leave, in addition to Dearness Allowance and House Rent Allowance as admissible in terms of Board's letter No. E(P&A)II-2002/HRA-2 dated 19.02.2002."
5. Sub-rule 2(a) of Rule 7 shall be substituted with the following:-  
"During study leave availed in India, a Railway servant shall draw leave salary equal to the pay that the Railway servant drew while on duty immediately before proceeding on such leave, in addition to Dearness Allowance and House Rent Allowance as admissible in terms of Board's letter No. E(P&A)II-2002/HRA-2 dated 19.02.2002."
6. In sub-rule 2(c) of Rule 7, the words "as envisaged in sub-rule (2) of rule 8," shall be omitted.
7. Sub-rule 2(d) of Rule 7 shall be omitted.
8. Rules 8, 9 & 10 shall be omitted.
9. Rule 11 shall be substituted with the following:-  
"11. **Admissibility of Allowances during study leave:** Except for House Rent Allowance as admissible in terms of Board's letter No. E(P&A)II-2002/HRA-2 dated 19.02.2002 and the Dearness Allowance, no other allowance shall be paid to a Railway servant in respect of the period of study leave granted to him."
10. In sub-rule 1(i) of Rule 14, the words "Study Allowance" shall be omitted.

**Ref:- Eastern Railway's letter No.E.77/o/Vol.VIII, dated 06.03.2017.**

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With reference to Eastern Railway's letter under reference, it is stated that the matter has been considered in Board's office and it has been observed that on the identical issue a clarification already stands issued to Southern Railway vide Board's letter No. E(P&A)II-2002/HRA-2 dt. 19.02.2002 (copy enclosed) clarifying that the period of 120 days mentioned in Board's letter no. E(P&A)II-82/HRA-2 dated 04.02.1982 had been revised to 180 days in terms of the amendment carried out to Rule 1707 of IREC-II vide Board's letter no. E(P&A)II/89/HRA-48 dt. 07.08.1992. It was further stated in the letter dt. 19.02.2002 that the employees proceeding on study leave are entitled to House Rent Allowance and Compensatory (City) Allowance for first 180 days of the study leave and continuation of these allowances beyond 180 days is subject to the production of certificates prescribed in Para 1707(iii) of Indian Railway Establishment Code, Volume-II, 1987 Edition. It may however, be noted that CCA has already been abolished vide Board's letter no. E(P&A)II-2008/HRA-10 dt. 12.09.2008 (RBE No.110/2008).

2. Thus, necessary action on the above lines may be ensured.

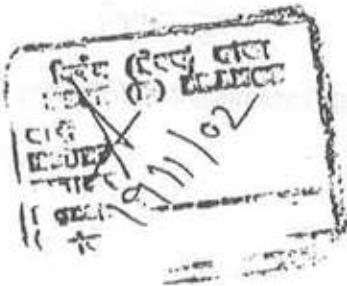

**Subject: Reckoning of period spent on Study Leave for earning leave.**

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In terms of Sub-rule (2) under Sub-heading - Counting of study leave for promotion, pension, seniority, leave and increments of Rule 556 of the Railway Services (Liberalised Leave) Rules, 1949, of the Indian Railway Establishment Code Vol. I, 1985 Edition, the period spent on study leave shall not count for earning leave other than half pay leave under the Liberalised Leave Rules. **Sub: Filling the vacancies arising out of Study Leave/EOL sanctioned to ADMOs in IRMS.**

**Ref.: SCR's Letter No. SCR/P-HQ/294/Gaz/8/MD/RB/Vol.I dated 20.06.2018.**

Please refer to SCR's letter cited under reference wherein it has been conveyed that South Central Railway will engage 11 CMPs under GM's power in order to meet the requirement of doctors in Divisional/Sub Divisional and Central Hospital due to sanction of Study Leave/EOL to 11 doctors.

The above reference has been examined in Board's office in consultation with Finance and Medical Directorates and it has been decided with the approval of Director General (Pers.) as under:-

(i) In view of the large pending list of regular ADMO Probationers waiting for transfer to SCR on spouse/other genuine grounds, the existing 11 vacancies in IRMS on SCR arising due to grant of Study Leave/EOL to doctors shall be filled by posting of regular IRMS doctors who are waiting for transfer to SCR. Posting orders are therefore being issued from Board's office with the approval of Board (MS). Accordingly, the process of engaging CMPs against these vacancies should be stopped immediately by the Zonal Railway.

(ii) In future, whenever vacancies of doctors arise on SCR due to grant Study Leave/EOL, the Zonal Railway should inform such vacancies to Board immediately for posting of regular doctors.

(iii) Doctors who have been sanctioned Study Leave/EOL for study purpose under GM's power or the doctors who will be sanctioned such leave in future, should be informed by the Zonal Railway that they will be considered for posting on SCR on return from Study Leave/EOL only as per the availability of the vacancies in IRMS in SCR. If for any reason vacancies are not available on SCR, Board should be informed accordingly for posting of such doctors on other Zonal Railways.

**Sub: Engagement of Medical Practitioners on contract basis.**

In terms of the instructions issued by Ministry of Railways on the subject, in order to meet the shortage of regular doctors on Indian Railways, engagement of Medical Practitioners on contract basis is made with the personal approval of General Managers in consultation with FA&CAO for a maximum of five terms with each term of engagement being for not more than one year and each contract being entered afresh. The detailed guidelines for such engagement are laid down in Railway Board's letters No. 96/E(GR)II/9/16 dated 15/1/99, 8/3/2001, 1/3/2002, 21/8/2003 and 12/3/2008.


2. Ministry of Railways have reviewed these instructions and have in partial modifications of the above instructions decided as under:

- (i) The tenure of Contract Medical Practitioners, beyond the present maximum of five terms of one year each, be extended by another period of two terms of one year each to a total of seven terms. Grant of such extension of two terms of one year each beyond five terms shall be subject to assessing the performance of the concerned Contract Medical Practitioner (CMP) and recommendation for such extension by a Committee of officers consisting of CMD, CPO and one more HOD Member and approval of General Manager.
- (ii) Contract Medical Practitioner may also be engaged against temporary vacancies of doctors arising out of sanctioned Extra Ordinary Leave (EOL) of one year or more.

The other terms and conditions of engagement and the method of selection as laid down by Railway Board in its earlier instructions shall remain unchanged.

3. This issues with the concurrence of Finance Directorate of the Ministry of Railways.


